



Head of School Position Description

Founded as a mission of St. Martin's-in-the-Field Episcopal Church in 1957, St. Martin'sin-the-Field Episcopal School (SMES) seeks a Head of School to begin July 2022 or 2023. The School's academic curriculum and holistic co-curriculum progress through its three divisions—Preschool, Lower School (K-4) and Middle School (5-8)--to meet the needs of students at each developmental stage. St. Martin's educates students to learn with confidence, serve with compassion, and lead with character; and its graduates matriculate to selective public and independent secondary programs.

Mission

The mission at St. Martin's is based firmly in Episcopal principles: "We seek to inspire in students a love of inquiry, a sustaining faith, and a generous spirit open to ideas, peoples of the world, and a call to service. At St. Martin's, students discover who they are as learners, leaders, and friends. St. Martin's creates a welcoming community encouraging each individual to grow in Confidence, Compassion and Character, grounded in the knowledge that each is a child of God." Every student, every teacher, every staff member and administrator live our mission.

EDUCATIONAL PHILOSOPHY: EDUCATING THE WHOLE CHILD

The educational philosophy at SMES is centered on educating the whole child and is inspired by a core belief that each student is blessed with unique intellectual, social, emotional, and spiritual promise. Each student is supported by caring staff to discover their learning strengths and styles and to reach their potential for success, leadership, and service to others.

Each child's needs are met through enrichment, support, and differentiation in small classes led by dedicated teachers. Our interdisciplinary approach combines aspects of the humanities, mathematics, arts, technology, and the sciences from Preschool through grade 8. We emphasize innovative and problem-based learning, engaging play, and meaningful practice, giving students many resources to draw from in finding their way forward. In our small community, students learn to self-advocate and to respect one another's ideas, growing in their sense of self. We have high expectations of our students and we are mindful that success in the 21st century requires our students to practice the foundational skills of critical thinking, collaboration, communication, and creativity.

The Opportunity

With the recent addition of a new Middle School and Administration building and the renovation of its Preschool and Kindergarten, the School has grown recently to 293 students. Well managed financially, the School maintains a significant cash reserve and expects to retire the remaining construction debt in 2022-2023. Currently led by an experienced Interim Head, St. Martin's is preparing its self-study for an AIMS reaccreditation Visiting Team in October 2022. As an Episcopal School, the Interim Head of School works closely with the Rector of St. Martin's-in- the-Field Episcopal Church to serve the pastoral and educational needs of Anne Arundel County and the greater Annapolis area.



As the SMES Head of School leads a faculty of over 40 professionals and staff, teaching and administrative experience in other independent school communities is essential. In addition to sustaining the positive relationship between the School and Church, the next Head of School should have the skill to hire, develop, and retain exceptional teachers, as well as experience with enrollment management, school finances, marketing, and fundraising. Most importantly, St. Martin's next Head of School should love working with colleagues and students to create a challenging and happy learning environment.
