MONDAYS:

Tippi Jam (Tippi Toes)

Preschool & Pre-K

Mondays, October 3, 17, 24, 31, November 7, 14 (3:00-3:30)

Tippi Jam is an introductory dance class where three- to five-year-old students learn the basics - listening to a teacher, basic dance choreography, meeting other children and expressing their creativity. The goal is the students learn about the dance environment, learn choreography and complete dances, make new friends, experience independence and gain confidence. The classes are filled with energetic, imaginative, positive, and fun songs! \$120 (Min # of students: 6; Max: 15)

Tippi Pro (Tippi Toes)

Grades K - 4th

Tippi Pro is a class for children ages 5-10 years old. Tippi Pro is a ballet & jazz dance class for school-aged dancers ready for a bit of challenge, while still enjoying the fun and encouraging atmosphere of Tippi Toes! The goal over time would be to learn the basic fundamental foundation of true ballet techniques, to further improve upon various other styles of dance. This class learns fun, upbeat, & traditional dances consisting of ballet & jazz elements. **\$120 (Min # of students: 6; Max: 15)**

Native American Crafts & Activities (John Fishback)

Grades 1st - 6th

Mondays, October 3, 17, 31, November 7, 14 (3:45 – 4:45)

Students will learn about indigenous peoples of North America through unique crafts, games, nature study, artifacts, murals and demonstrations. Children will choose each week the projects they want to construct such as lacrosse sticks, leather bags, moccasins, rattles, dreamcatchers, shields, cornhusk figures and darts, clay, mini bows, bone and rock tools and much more... And each week they play fun games, explore Native American technology and culture, do nature awareness activities like blind fold rope walk, play games such as fox and rabbit, camouflage hiding and capture the flag along with demonstrations of bow drill, atl-atl, wild plant rope making and wild food. Don't miss this opportunity to give your child a real connection to the natural world through Native American traditional skills, history, games and activities.
